4-H Exhibitor Eligibility

- Must have passed their 8th birthday, but not have passed their 19th birthday, before January 1 of the current year.
- Must be a member of an organized Huntingdon County 4-H club that carries the specific project.
- Must be a member in good standing.

FFA Exhibitor Eligibility

- Must be a current dues paying member carrying the specific project under the supervision of a Vocational Agriculture Instructor in a school recognized to show at the Huntingdon County Fair.
- A member may retain active membership until November 30, following the fourth National FFA Convention after graduation from high school. Active membership cannot be retained beyond the member's twenty-third birthday.

Livestock exhibitors receive Quality Assurance training prior to showing at the fair.

Entry Forms

Market Livestock Exhibition

- Market livestock must be tagged at the Fall or Spring Tag Day with the official HCJLC ear tag/verified 840 tag.
- Exhibitors must be on time to weigh, show, and sell.
- Market animals must be present at their species weigh-in time. Late arrivals due to extraordinary circumstances will be weighed at the discretion of the livestock superintendents.
- Exhibitors may only weigh, show, and sell a maximum of 4 tagged market animals, including meat pens.
- No reweighs. No replacements.
- Animals not making weight must be removed from the fairgrounds by midnight of weigh-in day.
- Market animals must be shown in the ring and be sold through the Junior Livestock Sale on Friday.

Health and General Rules

Adhere to Animal Health Regulations, Livestock and Dairy General Rules, and the Code of Show Ring Ethics.

Housekeeping

- Exhibitors shall clean or get stall area ready to be cleaned mechanically by 2 p.m. Saturday, the last day of the fair. If the area is not cleaned satisfactorily, \$50 per head will be deducted from the sale check or billed for those exhibiting breeding projects only.
- The fair is not responsible for personal items or equipment left behind.

Substitute Showman Criteria

- Conflict between the exhibitor's livestock show and another fair premium contest on the fairgrounds. Not covered: Nonpremium contests or extracurricular activities.
- Sickness or physical injury after arriving at the show preventing the owner from showing his/her own animal.
 Previous injury or illness prohibiting an exhibitor from showing requires a doctor's excuse.
- Exhibitor has two or more animals in the same class or of different breeds showing at the same time.

Anyone receiving substitute showman permission attending the show while physically capable of showing will be disqualified. Substitute Showman must:

- Be approved by the species or livestock superintendent.
- Notify the ring man that he/she is not the owner.
- Be another 4-H or FFA member of the same age or younger.

Medication Withdrawal

- Market exhibitors may not exhibit any animal that will still
 be within the medication withdrawal period on sale day. If
 upon slaughter a recent treatment with drugs or biologics is
 the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the exhibitor will
 bear the loss of the carcass.
- Fair personnel reserve the right to blood test animals for illegal use of drugs or antibiotics.
- Medication given fair week must have veterinarian approval and Livestock Superintendents must be notified.
- Animals receiving medication with a withdrawal period beyond sale day must be removed from the fair immediately.

Section 6.1 - 4-H and FFA Dairy Goats

Tuesday, 9 a.m., Swine Arena

- 1. 4-H and FFA exhibitors must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging in the show ring.
- 2. All entries must be ADGA registered goats in the 4-H or FFA exhibitor's name by June 1 or documentation of registering goats through ADGA by June 1.
- 3. Dairy Goat Exhibitors must enter all herd classes on their entry form or in the Fair Entry registration.
- 4. Please inform superintendents as soon as possible if an animal will not be exhibited. This will help with stall assignments.
- 5. All goats must be polled or dehorned to be entered.
- 6. Exhibitors are limited to two entries in classes 1-15 for each breed.
- 7. No goats may be brought to the fair that are not entered in the show.
- 8. 4-H and FFA exhibitors will wear white pants and white shirt. Club logos permitted.
- 9. Class descriptions are the same as the open show. (See Department 6)
- 10. Dairy goats are released at 9 p.m. Friday, and must be on exhibit in their assigned stalls until then.

Section 6.2 - 4-H and FFA Dairy Goat Showmanship

Tuesday, 9 a.m., Swine Arena, following Dairy Goat Show

- 1. 4-H and FFA members may show an animal in showmanship contests provided it has been carried as their dairy goat project.
- 2. 4-H and FFA exhibitors will wear white pants and white shirt. Club logos permitted.
- 3. Classes will be determined by splitting all showmen into 4 divisions by their actual age. Classes 01 and 02 will be the oldest and will show first. Classes 03 and 04 will be the youngest.
- 4. Showmanship will be judged by ADGA guidelines.

Section 6.3 - 4-H and FFA Market Goats

Sunday, 1 p.m., Large Arena, following Market Goat Showmanship.

- 1. Exhibitors can show a maximum of two market goats. They may be does or wethers and may have horns.
- 2. Please inform superintendents as soon as possible if an animal will not be exhibited. This will help with stall assignments.
- 3. 4-H and FFA exhibitors must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging in the show ring.
- 4. Market goats must have sufficient length of ear to carry an ear tag.
- 5. Wethers must be castrated prior to Spring Tag Day.
- 6. Market goats must be weighed at the small scale from 1-2 p.m. on Saturday, August 2, 2025.
- 7. Market goats must weigh at least 65 lbs. to be eligible to show and sell at the fair. Weight classes will be set after weigh-in.
- 8. Exhibitors will wear appropriate attire. No hats, shorts, jeans with holes or open-toed footwear.
- 9. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding, watering and caring for their market goats until they are loaded on a truck after the sale.
- 10. Barn cleanup and pen take down will be at 9 a.m. the last Saturday of the fair. If pens are not cleaned by noon Saturday morning, the exhibitor will be charged \$50 cleaning fee.

Section 6.4 - 4-H and FFA Market Goat Showmanship

Sunday, 1 p.m., Large Arena

- 1. Exhibitors may show an animal in showmanship provided it has been carried as their market goat project.
- 2. Approved goat collars, extensions, and show halters are permitted in the show ring. No rope halters.
- 3. There will be no placings or merits for fitting, however, goats must be clipped, clean, and presentable for judging.
- 4. Classes will be determined by splitting all showmen into 8 divisions by their actual age. Classes 01 and 02 will be the oldest and will show first. Classes 07 and 08 will be the youngest and show last.
- 5. Showmanship will be judged using recognized market goat guidelines.

Section 6.5 - 4-H and FFA Goat Obstacle Course

Tuesday, 7 p.m., Swine Arena.

- 1. The obstacle course is set up to encourage proper handling of animals and to demonstrate the exhibitor's skills.
- 2. Contest will be held separately for goat and sheep exhibitors.
- 3. An exhibitor may enter once for each species. Exhibitor must show his/her own animal.
- 4. A score will be given for several obstacles maneuvered. Time will be kept to break ties.

Market Animal Exhibitor-Required Documents

Drug Free Affidavit

It is the responsibility of all market exhibitors not to exhibit any animal that will still be within the medication withdrawal period on sale day. Any medication that must be administered during fair week can only be done by meeting all 3 of the following criteria:

- 1. Medication must be administered under a veterinarian's supervision.
- 2. All vet expenses will be assumed by the exhibitor.
- 3. The Junior Livestock Committee officers must be notified prior to medication being administered. Any animal receiving medication with a withdrawal period then must be removed from the fair as soon as possible.

I have read and understand the regulation listed above and hereby agree to abide by the regulations. I declare that the market animal(s) I have entered in the Huntingdon County Fair have not received any drugs or treatment with biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter.
